Jenkins Green Pond Update

We have an update for you about the pond. As you know we were unable to carry out the work as we had hoped last year, but we have been given the go ahead to do some work during this year. I have agreed to continue cutting the grass at Jenkins Green for another year and to continue keeping clear around the pond and cutting back as necessary.

We are pleased to say, the frogs are back and also we think we have a duck nesting. We hope to put up some bat boxes in the near future, which have been made by the 2nd Carlton Colville Cub Scout Group, for which we are very grateful. Owls and a kingfisher have been sighted and the resident moorhens look to be getting ready to breed, which is a good sign. The daffodils and the Primroses are a joy to see and we can expect Bluebells very soon. If any residents close to Jenkins Green would like to help, we would be very grateful.

A piece of history: Parkhill Hotel

We are fortunate to have this elegant Grade II listed property in Oulton. Parkhill Hotel country house hotel and restaurant is set within acres of beautiful private gardens and only a short drive North from the Village. It boasts many feature's including Late 18th century brick, slate tiles, various bow windows, fluted Greek Doric columns which provides the porch for the 6 panelled door with its overlight.

Little is known about the owners or the buildings on site prior Mid 18th century, albeit a Mr Roe owned the property who was a brick maker. Early 19th century the property was sold and the owner increased the holdings to 400 acres. In 1850, the property was sold to a Mr Woods who extended the property on the South side, turning the main building into a small country home. It was then sold again to the Rackman family.

In 1950, the Council, Lowestoft Borough we assume, purchased all the estate and let the land as 4 small holdings, one of which is Spinney Farm. Mid 1950's, a Major General Stowell purchased the House and remaining grounds, he then sold this on to its present owners in 1980, who adapted it for

its current use as a Hotel and Restaurant.
